**Did You Know...?**

Last month I wrote about the women, and how they are the backbone of our church.

It would only be fair to pay tribute to the men who were the leaders of the pioneers who settled the Larchmont/Fern Hill area. After the ladies raised the \$50.00 to purchase the land, Philo Hubbell, Andrew Mann, and Harvey Vanderhoof purchased an acre from the Tacoma Land Co. on January 23, 1893, and became All Saints' first trustees.

Soon after the property was purchased, they held a ~~bee~~ to clear the land. While the men worked, the women prepared a wash-boiler full of corned beef and cabbage. As the story goes, there was not a drop of broth left by the hungry workers.

After the land was cleared, they contracted to build the chapel/meeting hall for the sum of \$593.75. Since money was tight, the men agreed to pay \$100 as soon as the roof was finished, \$93.75 when the building was completed, and \$100.00 a month for the next 4 months.

In addition to Philo Hubbell, Andrew Mann, and Harvey Vanderhoof, some of our pioneer fathers were Elim Preacher, Edward Powell, Alfred Knight, Edward Jackson Preacher, J. F. Fitch, E. L. Jones, and William Bonney.

In March of 1912 the building was wired for electric light. The men raised the \$8.00 needed to do the job, and this was paid to a Mr. Craig who did the work. At this time a fund was started to fence the church property.

Throughout the years there were many men who attended to the church/meeting hall upkeep and grounds. Although there is no mention of their names, they are saluted today.

In 1952 there were eight men on the Bishop's Committee: James Philips, Ned Richards, James Washburn, Alton Ellington, John Smidt, Fred English, Carl Knudson, and John Frelin.

In the 50's Dr. Douglas Northrup became our first appointed clergy under adverse conditions. Bishop Stephen Baynes remarks to the congregation: "It is sometimes easier to start a new church than to activate an old one." The repairs were endless: repair to the heating systems for both church and parish hall, plumbing, roofing, painting, and a parking area. The single floor in the church was old and worn, so new floors were laid. Seating capacity was inadequate, so new pews were added and painted. The porch was enclosed to form a vestibule and concrete steps were added. The sanctuary was enlarged to make room at the altar rail to contain the choir. All windows were re-glazed to keep out the cold, and the buildings were painted. The workers included Messrs. Mauldins, Richards, Knox, Kuper, Jewett, English, Ellingson, Gannon, Washburn, Smidts, Knakson, Frelin, Phillips, Gilliam, Bardtke, Newsshams, Sherry, Selby, Vetter, Botsford, Borst, Parkinson, Iverson, Garnett, Hanson, Studholme & Wilson.




Father discussed the idea that Larry Talbert had to invite Sandra to offer us a good-bye recital before she leaves in December. ECW has offered to host a reception.

**Did You Know...? (continued from p. 1)**

Our congregation grew from 4 people in 1951 to over 100 in 1958. In those years the church was updated and remodeled by the men of All Saints

In 1959 Dr. Northrup, D.D. left for a warmer climate due to health issues. We welcomed the Rev. Stanley G. MacGirvin. Our first lay-readers were licensed, Mr. Leach, Mr. Green, and Mr. Johnson; and we had a seminarian, Roger Lund. At that time the Bishop's Committee members were Messrs. Washburn, Thomas, English, Ellingson, Wilson, Lynch, Knox, Iverson, Hall, Hilderbrand, Newsham, Bardtice, Studholme, and Sherry.

In 1964, October 2nd, the Little Church, once the community meeting hall, was destroyed by fire seventy one years after it was built.

The Bishop's Committee in 1965 consisted of 18 members, as the congregation numbered in the three hundreds. They were Messrs. Lane, Roley, Lee, Knox, Leacy, Brainard, Peterson, Reed, Throckmorton, Botsford, Hall, Sousely, Jennerjand, Andrews, Kuper, Richards, Eager, and Gidding.

A contract for the new church was let on February 16, 1965. An expansion of property was acquired. There is no recorded date, just that it was the Withrow property adjoining All Saints Mission. My personal remembrance is 1962. In 1966 two women were elected to the Bishop's Committee, Mrs. Fred (Lee) English and Mrs. George (Garnett) Jennerjahn. This ended the tradition of men only on the Bishop's Committee.

All Saints men have sustained us through the years with parish hall roofing, grounds keeping, painting, porch and ramp building. Although I do not have names and dates for the last 33 years I will mention as many as I can remember. No slight is intended if I leave someone out. Messrs. Roley, Knox, English, Jennerjahn, King, Hilderbrand, Golden, Wagner, Talbert, Finkhouse, Sousely, Lee, Barnett, Pelham, Mueller, Marshall, Hayes, Shepard, T. Stewart, M. Stewart, Miller, Harrison, Hemenway, Garman, Favors, George, Biever, Blodgett, McBride, Larson, Pryor, Kolb, Moon, Green. These and many more men have worked with dedication and devotion in keeping wind and rain out and prayer in. They have mowed, raked, weeded, and shoveled the pathways to worship.

Hats off to our pioneer men and the keepers of our buildings since the beginnings of us, All Saints Episcopal Mission!!
